

Avalanche Awareness

TRAINING PROGRAMME

INTRODUCTION

The New Zealand Mountain Safety Council (MSC) has offered avalanche awareness training for over 25 years. Avalanche Awareness courses for skiers, snowboarders and climbers provide a first step to gaining an appreciation of the avalanche phenomenon and what is needed to make decisions about personal safety when travelling in terrain that may be exposed to avalanche hazards.

MSC also provides a Backcountry Avalanche course for those interested in developing more advanced observation and route finding skills for winter recreation in the mountains.

Both courses focus on skills needed for personal safety, but also dedicate time to learning how to rescue a companion or small party.

The Avalanche Awareness course is a prerequisite for the Backcountry Avalanche course.

CONTENT

The Avalanche Awareness course involves both a lecture and a field day.

The course covers:

- Mountain weather
- Identification of avalanche terrain
- Basic route finding and decision making
- Companion rescue
- Safety equipment (including use of transceivers).

The Backcountry Avalanche course is provided over four days.

The course covers:

- Characteristics of avalanche phenomenon
- Snowpack factors
- Human factors that influence decision making
- Group travel
- Small party search and rescue.

Course content for both programmes was developed and is moderated by MSC to ensure national standards.

LECTURES

A lecture is held in the evening prior to each field day, and lasts about two and a half hours. Attendance is a prerequisite for the field days, and attendees are encouraged to bring a notepad.

FIELD DAYS

Field days last all day.

For Avalanche Awareness a 'Certificate of Attendance' is issued by the provider. For Backcountry Avalanche a 'Certificate of Completion' is issued following an assessment.

The provider will supply the following details on receipt of payment:

- What to bring
- What is provided
- What the course fee includes (This depends on the need for accommodation; lift tickets and/or transport. Course fees are for the instruction only.)
- Where to meet
- Postponement and cancellation provisions

Some providers have safety equipment. However participants should bring their own transceiver (457 kHz only), shovel (metal preferred) and collapsible probe (180cm minimum) if possible.

INSTRUCTORS

All instructors are avalanche professionals. Most work in the mountain environment as guides or ski patrollers and have valuable and extensive experience to share with course participants.

SAFETY

MSC courses are operated under specific operational procedures and safety plans. All participants are required to follow instructions to ensure safe practices are maintained.

Most courses will be run within the confines of a commercially operated ski area. Backcountry Avalanche courses may be run outside a ski area but will use these facilities for access and egress.

BOOKINGS AND PAYMENTS

Local contact details are listed in the calendar. Payment at time of registration is required to secure attendance. Numbers are limited due to safety requirements with respect to instructor-student ratios. Minimum age requirements apply.

Avalanche Awareness course fee (only) - \$75, Backcountry Avalanche course fee (only) \$500; additional costs such as lift tickets, transport and accommodation vary depending on the venue and course. Avalanche safety gear is available for hire in most locations.

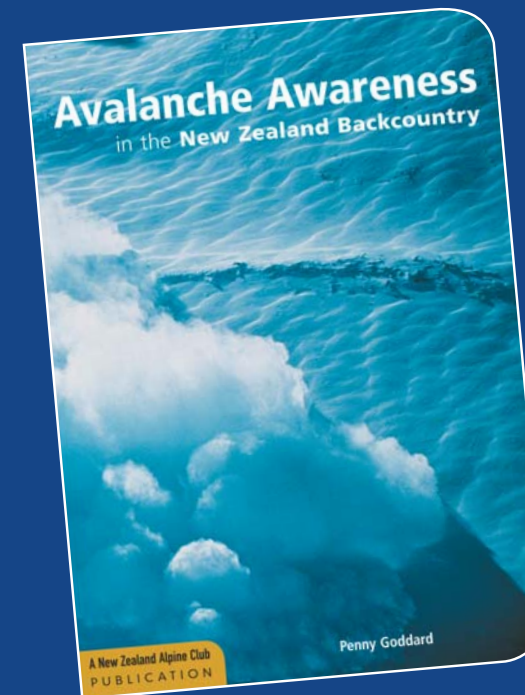

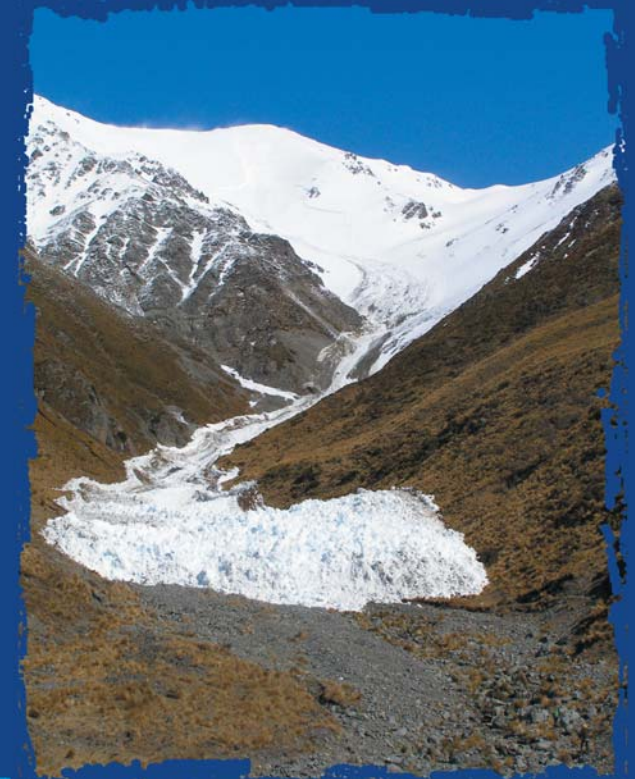
